Program:

Judy Smith introduced Cody George, Horticulturist from Crystal Bridges Museum, Bentonville. The title of his presentation was, "Balancing Aesthetics with Biodiversity: The Gardens of Crystal Bridges." There are 3.5 miles of trails in the garden with 24 outdoor sculptures. Total Genera: 238; Total Taxa: 492. Eight-five percent of the plants at Crystal Bridges are native plants. Natives are part of the ongoing goal, discovering the balance between being aesthetically pleasing and biologically responsible. He stressed the need to increase biodiversity by planting natives. We should be aware that habitat loss = loss in biodiversity. With proper plant and site selection natives can be more drought tolerant and

disease resistant. "In our every deliberation, we must consider the impact of our decisions on the next seven generations." From the Great Law of the Iroquois Confederacy.
