### Monthly Meeting Reports

The March 6<sup>th</sup> minutes was presented for approval as published on website. Jane Scroggs moved that the minutes be accepted as presented, Dolores Stamps seconded. The membership approved the minutes as presented.

### Old Business

#### Evergreen cemetery

Chris Bell and Ginny Wiseman, Community Outreach chairs, have met with Marilyn Heifner, Cemetery Board Member. The committee is working with a landscape architect on entrance garden design, preparing a suggested plant list, having trees removed at entrance, and planning backhoe work. Chris and Ginny report that there is a \$2K budget for the project. A meeting will be planned for MG volunteers to organize activities.
