



200-PLUS SANCTIONED VOLUNTEER HOURS AWARDSWashington County Master Gardeners

Guidelines: This local award was started in 2011 by the WCMG Awards Committee to recognize a Master Gardener or Master Gardener Rookie (first year) who records 200 or more sanctioned volunteer hours to the organization ending on December 15 each year. Non-sanctioned and Education hours are not considered for this award. Members receive the appropriate lapel pin at the annual WCMG Awards Program. There are no nomination requirements.

The Membership Committee's Online Hours Managers maintain the records and provide the summary list of qualified WCMG volunteers to the Awards Committee prior to the awards program. The Awards Committee purchases the pewter lapel pins and maintains the supply at the Extension Service office.

TROWEL PIN - Started in **2011** and recognizes WCMG members or trainees who record 200 or more sanctioned volunteer hours to the organization in a year.

<u>WATERING CAN PIN</u> - Started in **2016** and recognizes WCMG members who have been awarded the Trowel Award (200-plus sanctioned volunteer hours) for four years. For the fifth year of qualifying for a trowel, they will, instead, receive the Watering Can pin.

<u>WHEELBARROW PIN</u> - Started in **2020** and recognizes WCMG members who have been awarded the Watering Can Award (200-plus sanctioned volunteer hours) for four years. For the fifth year of qualifying for a watering can, they will, instead, receive the Wheelbarrow pin.
