The WCMG Awards Committee is comprised of prior Washington County Master Gardener of the Year award winners. The committee is responsible for recommending to the Executive Committee eligible candidates for special recognition including, but not limited to Master Gardener of the Year, Rookie of the Year, Project of the Year, Excellence in Education, Friend of Master Gardeners (organizational and individual), Mentor of the Year, and "Yes, I Can" Awards. The Awards Committee ensures that the county's awards criteria match the state MG awards criteria. committee may also establish special award categories for volunteer recognition. Committee recommendations shall be made to the Executive Committee **prior to October 15** each year.

EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION (EIE) – This award, started in 2015, is designed to recognize an outstanding WCMG project that demonstrates significant learning in a targeted audience(s.) The project must target one of the following groups: • Youth/School Program • Demonstration or Research Gardens • Underserved Audience (i.e., seniors, people with disabilities, low-income families, incarcerated individuals.) The project must have been implemented for one full year. The project should be easy for other MG programs to replicate.

TROWEL AWARD PIN* - This local award, started in **2011**, recognizes WCMG members who record 200-Plus sanctioned volunteer hours to the organization in a year. (No forms.)

<u>WATERING CAN AWARD PIN</u>* - This local award, started in **2016**, recognizes WCMG members who have been awarded the Trowel Award (200-Plus sanctioned volunteer hours) for four years. For the fifth year of qualifying for a trowel, they will, instead, be awarded the Watering Can pin (No forms.)

<u>WHEELBARROW AWARD PIN</u>* - This local award, started in **2020**, recognizes WCMG members who have been awarded the Watering Can Award (200-Plus sanctioned volunteer hours) for four years. For the fifth year of qualifying for a watering can, they will, instead, be awarded the Wheelbarrow pin (No forms.)

GOLDEN BUTTERFLY AWARD PIN* - This local award, started in 2024, recognizes WCMG members who have been awarded the Wheelbarrow Award (200-Plus sanctioned volunteer hours) for four years. For the fifth year of qualifying for a wheelbarrow pin, they will, instead, be awarded the Golden Butterfly pin (No forms.)

JOYCE MENDENHALL "YES, I CAN" AWARD* - This local award, started in 2008, recognizes WCMGs and/or Rookie (trainees) who have made exceptional contributions to the MG program, Extension Service and county. They are always ready, willing, and demonstrate a "can do" attitude by participating in WCMG projects, committees and other activities.
