



LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARDS

Washington County Master Gardeners

POLICY:

- 1. Length of Service (LOS) awards information is gathered from all Arkansas Master Gardener programs.
- 2. The LOS awards recognition if part of the award ceremony at the Arkansas State MG Conference.
- 3. Active WCMG members shall record at least 20 hours of volunteer work (minimum 10 hours on sanctioned projects/committees, with the remaining 10 hours on sanctioned projects, committees, or non-sanctioned projects) as well as 20 hours of continuing education.
- 4. WCMG trainees, both self-paced online training and in person training, shall record at least 40 hours of volunteer work (minimum 20 hours on sanctioned project/committees, with the remaining 20 hours on sanctioned projects, committees, or non-sanctioned projects) as well as 20 hours of continuing education within 12 months of completing training.
- 5. WCMG members who remain active for 15 years will receive lifetime membership status at the annual MG state meeting.
- 6. WCMG members do not accumulate service time while on Leave of Absence status.
- 7. Lifetime members get a new name badge and are not required to pay dues or repay any hours.
- 8. Lifetime members are encouraged to continue recording volunteer and education hours to accumulate years of service recognition beyond 15 years. They should record at least 10 work/project hours each year to receive Lifetime-Plus designations.

PROCEDURE:

- 1. WCMG members and trainees must record all their volunteer work and education hours into the online recording system prior to December 15.
- 2. WCMG Membership Committee Online Hours Manager(s) provide the county's list of WCMG recipients for Lifetime, 5, 10, 20 (Lifetime) and Lifetime Plus service pins to Arkansas MG Office by mid-February each year.
- 3. Years of service (5,10-years round pins,) Lifetime (15-years) name badges, and Lifetime-Plus (over 15 years in five-year increments) pins are rewarded based on the lists received from each county from the previous year. The pins are ordered and paid for by State MG Office.
- 4. Julie Treat at the State MG Office will send the list of qualified recipients to the county's MG Presidents and Master Gardener CEAs.
- 5. Years of Service pins and Lifetime name badges are usually delivered at the **annual April County 76 meeting** and the **state MG conference** for those counties who have members that attend either of those events.
- 6. Counties that do not attend either events, will have the items mailed to their county offices.
- 7. Service pins and/or 15-year Lifetime name badges are provided to WCMG members at the earliest available date at a WCMG monthly meeting.
- 8. WCMG members who do not attend the meeting, may pick up their items at the county Extension Office.
- 9. To Replace Lifetime Badges:
 - a. There is a charge to WCMG members for any replacements.
 - b. Replacement requests for Lifetime name badges are emailed from Colin Massey to Julie Treat on an annual basis with the new graduate WCMG name badge orders.
 - c. Washington County provides Julie with the individual WCMG member name and mailing address.
 - d. Julie sends information to the vendor.
 - e. The WCMG member pays the vendor directly. Julie will notify member of the cost and where to send the money.
 - f. The WCMG member pays the vendor and the vendor mails name badge directly to each member.
